

Great Fulford

Congratulations to Geoffrey Preston Ltd for winning the FPDC 2013 award for a Fibrous and GRG Heritage Contract for Great Fulford. Geoffrey is one of the leading architectural sculptors of decorative plaster in the UK and has worked on many significant projects.

During the summer of 2013 Hayles and Howe were delighted to provide assistance to Geoffrey Preston for his recent restoration project in the Great Drawing Room at Great Fulford a Grade I listed property in Devon and home of the Fulford Family for 800 years. The project restored the ceiling of a beautifully proportioned double cube room adapted in the Georgian era.

Hayles and Howe's role on the project was to undertake all the flatwork and fixing, and run the plain running mouldings. The company also assisted in the moulding, casting and installation of Geoffrey's spectacular new ceiling in high quality traditional fibrous plaster. John Fowler was seconded to Geoffrey's Exeter workshop for several weeks to provide assistance in moulding and casting the distinctive ceiling. The design was based on circular geometry and every element related by proportion, the central panel was after the Tintoretto painting depicting the marriage of Bacchus and Ariadne.

A team of talented operatives including Derek Bond, Morgan Jones, Jolene Hill, John Fowler, Russell Hempstead and Matt Cook installed the ceiling in its grand setting working alongside Geoffrey's team of modellers. Geoffrey commented that "From their early planning and management of the project right through to their attention to detail in the finishing, Hayles and Howe's work was excellent and their team a pleasure to work with. The clients are delighted with the finished ceiling and so am I".

HAYLES AND HOWE MEND 1930's CLOCK

Pegasus House - Bristol

A beautifully restored art deco clock has been returned to its original position above the main door in the Boxkite Room in Pegasus House. The clock, which is made of plaster polished to look like wood, was first installed in the room when the building opened

in 1936.

Its period design incorporates two feathered wings folded beneath the clockface representing both flight and the passage of time and is in keeping with

the beautiful and architecturally important plaster window reveals. When the building was decommissioned, the clock was removed and taken to the aerospace museum

in Kemble for safe-keeping. It has remained there Jolene Hill (right) from Hayles and Howe and Paul Frost from Airbus. for more than 20 years.

But now Pegasus House is being used again, Bristol restoration experts Hayles and Howe have restored the clock to its former glory. It has been repaired, repolished and new, lightweight aluminium hands have been installed. Jolene Hill and Morgan Jones from Hayles and Howe brought the clock back to Pegasus House and carefully fitted it back where it belongs.


When it was originally installed, the mechanism slotted into a hole in the wall and was connected to the mains. Now it is battery operated - but from the front it looks exactly as it did before.

Senior Building and Construction Engineer Paul Frost said: "The clock was part of the original design of the room, and it's great to have it back in place."

B'er Chayim Temple, Cumberland, Maryland, USA



Two teams of Hayles and Howe. Inc.'s artisans traveled to western Maryland last week to begin work on the renovations of the plasterwork in the 1866 B'er Chayim Temple in Cumberland. The brick building had undergone an exterior renovation removing white paint and re-pointing its brick exterior nearly one year earlier. Services are temporarily



moved to another location in Cumberland, and in order to prepare the interior for its renovation, yards of canvas previously applied to consolidate the plaster were stripped from the walls and ceiling revealing former paint schemes and plasterwork which required more extensive consolidation.

Hayles and Howe's assiduous plasterers injected solutions of acrylic resin emulsion mixed with lime plaster and water in order to re-consolidate the 3-coat plaster. The second team of plasterers remains at the temple to repair large cracks and patches in order to restore the building to its original beauty.

CONSERVATION COURSE



House Mill

In mid-March two Bristol based craftsmen, Ben Francis and Nick Roden, attended a Building Crafts College Course leading to an award in Understanding Repair and Maintenance of Traditional Pre – 1919 Buildings.

The course took place over a couple of days in House Mill, a Grade I listed 18th century tidal mill, believed to be the largest still in existence. Having undergone extensive repair, restoration and conservation the building formed part of the focus of the course.

The lectures covered the history and philosophy behind conservation; the importance of a proper survey; structural problems and an intensive look at building materials; the effects of modern human intervention and long term issues such as the migration of salt in water. A practising conservation architect covered the labyrinthine structure of planning and permission.

The lads said it was a very interesting experience.
